

Effects of Exposure/overexposure

Eye Contact: slight irritant
Skin: slight irritant
Inhalation: may be irritating
Ingestion: if ingested, call physician

Emergency And First Aid Procedures

Eye Contact: flush with plenty of water, consult a physician
Skin: flush with water
Inhalation: remove to fresh air
Ingestion: do not induce vomiting, consult physician

Physician: Material contains Propylene Glycol, Dipropylene Glycol, Mono Methyl Ethyl and Butyrolacetone
